Washakie County

Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Survey

April 2021



Methods

The Washakie County Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Survey was designed by Align and administered by Goshen Help. Goshen Help recruited participants using social media, word of mouth from the Prevention Coalition, a newspaper article, and Facebook ads.

This report was prepared by Align and provides complete responses to every question on the survey. Percentages may not total 100% due to rounding and for check-all-that-apply questions. We excluded those who reported they did not live in Washakie County (5 respondents).

Because the data were obtained using a convenience sample, the results are not extrapolatable to all Washakie County residents. Sixty people responded to the survey and 56 responded to the income question. Of these 56, 9 were low income (based on 125% federal poverty level) and 47 were higher income. Because only 9 people represent the low-income category, we cannot assume their views represent all people with low income living in Washakie County.

Key Findings

The majority of respondents identified *employment* as a need in their communities, followed by *education*, then *support services*. Specifically within employment, respondents identified the need for *more jobs with better pay and benefits* and *affordable childcare during work hours*.

Employment

- More jobs with better pay and benefits
- Affordable childcare during work hours

Education

- More certificate/degree programs offered locally
- Increasing the community's knowledge of available education resources
- More services for adult education
- More accessible counseling to prepare students for tech or college

Support Services

- Substance misuse resources
- Youth services

Health

- More payment assistance programs for adult dental and/or hearing services
- More vision assistance programs for adults

Social/Behavioral Development

- More mental health resources for youth
- More assistance and resources for youth with history of substance misuse


Housing

- More affordable housing
- More grants to make home ownership and home rehab affordable

Income and Asset Building


- Information on how to access free credit counseling

- More access to broadband



2. WHAT IS YOUR MARITAL STATUS?









3. HOW MANY PEOPLE LIVE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD?

8. REASONS HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS ARE UNEMPLOYED


12 respondents gave reasons for household members being unemployed. Their responses included the following:









15. ARE YOU YOUR CHILD(REN)'S PRIMARY CARETAKER?








19. DO YOU NEED DIFFERENT EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION (DEPENDENT CARE) HELP?








23. WHAT TYPES OF INCOME DO YOU HAVE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD?

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




27. CIVIC ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT NEEDS

Low income n = 9Higher income n = 47




